About the Play

Three hundred years later, while on a field trip to the New Metropolitan Maritime Museum, pirate aficiondo and sixth-grader, Obie Tucker, discovers that she and Sharpe lack the same virtue: self-control. Just when Obie is about to be sent home from the only field trip she's ever been interested in, an eccentric museum curator presents Obie with a gift from Molly Sharpe herself!

Learning Objectives

- To help students understand how their actions impact themselves, each other, and the environment.
- To show the dierence between instant and delayed gratication.
- To provide strategies students can use when self-control is needed.
- To model what self-control looks like.
- To show positive consequences of practicing self-control and negative consequences of not using serlf-control
- To provide strategies students can use to recognize and learn from their mistakes after a lapse in self-control.

Questions to Ask

Be sure to ask your child questions about the play:

- Tell me about the play you saw at school today.
- What did you like about it?
- What did you learn from the play?
- What is self control?
- How will Obie's life be different after her experience at the New Metropolitan Maritime Museum with Captain Sharpe?
- Why is important to use self control when we are deciding what to do with our trash? What things can you recycle? What kinds of things can you compost?
- What are some things you can do to help you to remember to use your self control?
- How can you show self control at school? How about at home?


If you'd like to join in the fun, we need the following information from you:
